


El Dorado, Kansas

Industrial and Office Parks

El Dorado, Kansas, a community of 13,000, is located outside of Wichita - far enough away to identify as an individual community, but close enough to have access to all goods and services Wichita has to offer.

- The City of El Dorado is able to offer property in three different industrial park locations- the El Dorado Industrial Park, the El Dorado West Industrial Park and the El Dorado Business Park.
- **El Dorado has the capacity to provide more than 30 million gallons (30mgd) water daily to business customers.**
- City owned property, fairly flat and even land clear of flood plains, marsh land or otherwise protected area is available.
- Zoned light industrial (I-1) –ready to build.
- City water, sewer, and street extentions can be financed on multi-year term with special assessments.
- No business license fees in El Dorado.
- El Dorado Municipal Airport has two 4200+ foot runways.
- Savage Rail Port Facility within 5 miles.
- Over 428,000 people live within a 40 mile radius of the community.



Location, Location, location!

- El Dorado is conveniently located on the Kansas Turnpike I-35 with Kansas Highway 254 providing excellent east/west travel and Kansas 196 and Kansas 77 providing an excellent north/south option.
- Access to all highways within two miles from all industrial sites.


El Dorado's Unique Significance

- **Proximity to Wichita** - 20+ minutes with excellent transportation options, Kansas Highway 254 or I-35 (Kansas Turnpike).
- **Rail Service**- El Dorado is served by the main line of BNSF (46 trains per day) and a Union Pacific industrial lead line from Wichita. (6 trains per day with opportunity for customized service)
- **Home to-**
 - HollyFrontier El Dorado, the largest oil refinery in Kansas
 - Butler Community College, second largest community college in Kansas
 - Susan B. Allen Memorial Hospital, serving communities in and around Butler County
 - Industries- BG Products, Pioneer Balloon, Barton Solvents, C-Tech Industries.
 - 8,000 acre El Dorado Lake and State Park.

 - Recent industrial park development: 89-acre \$78 million capital investment




Cities within 1-day drive-




Population trend




Population by Age

Water Supply

The City of El Dorado is unique in that it is the only city in the State of Kansas to contract directly with the Corps of Engineers for its raw water supply, El Dorado Reservoir. The City holds sole ownership of all water to be used for the public water supply. El Dorado has an abundant capacity to provide 30 million gallons water daily (30mgd) or more to business customers in the community.

Rates for in-city customers:

Usage	Rate/100 cubic ft.
0 to 30,000 CF	\$1.24
Over 30,000 CF	\$1.18

Water pressure in El Dorado is generally between 30 - 60 psi, depending upon the elevation where you live and the size of the water distribution lines in your area.

Workforce

With over 428,000 people in a 40 mile radius of El Dorado, available workforce is more than sufficient. Because the areas east and north of El Dorado have a strong farm/ranch emphasis, many employers comment on the strong work ethic of employees hired from this region. The Butler Workforce Center offers excellent customer service to companies during and after their initial hiring process.

Training

BETA at Butler Community College is very responsive to the training needs of El Dorado businesses. BETA works with the Workforce Alliance of South Central Kansas and the Kansas Department of Commerce KIT and KIR programs to provide customized training for businesses in the Wichita area.
